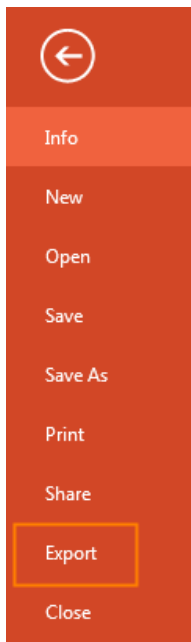


Creating Movie-Type Presentations

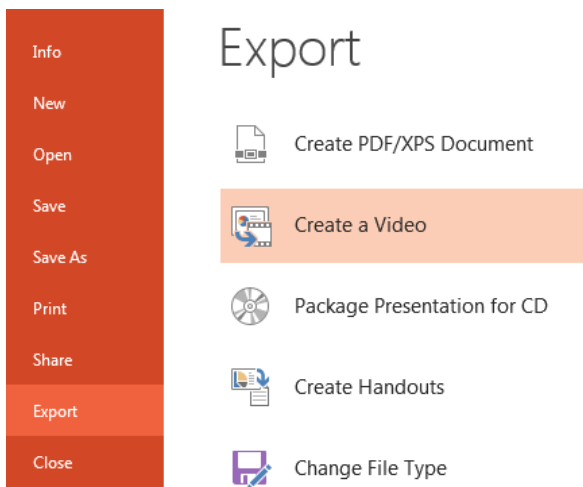
Step-by-Step Guide for Turning Presentations into Videos

Turning presentations into movies is a very simple process. Once you have your presentation complete, it's a simple matter of saving it to the correct file format. When you do this, the animations, timings, narrations, sounds, etc can be saved as well.

1. Click on File, then Export.



2. Select Create Video.




- Each tab has a drop-down that exposes different options.

Create a Video

Save your presentation as a video that you can burn to a disc, upload to the web, or email

- Incorporates all recorded timings, narrations, and laser pointer gestures
- Preserves animations, transitions, and media




Computer & HD Displays

Use Recorded Timings and Narrations
Slides that do not have timings will use the default duration set below. Any recorded laser point...

Seconds spent on each slide:

- Click Computer & HD Displays for large file sizes with high quality. Click the second option, Internet & DVD if medium size and quality is needed. Select Portable Devices to create smaller sizes with lower quality.





Internet & DVD
For uploading to the Web and burning to standard DVD (Medium — 852 x 480)

Portable Devices
Portable device video quality; Small text may be difficult to read (Small — 424 x 240)

- Next, select the appropriate option for your presentation: Use Recorded Timings and Narrations to capture your timings and narration in the video and “Don’t Use” to avoid capturing them.

Slides that do not have timings will use the default duration set below. Any recorded laser pointer gestures will also be included.

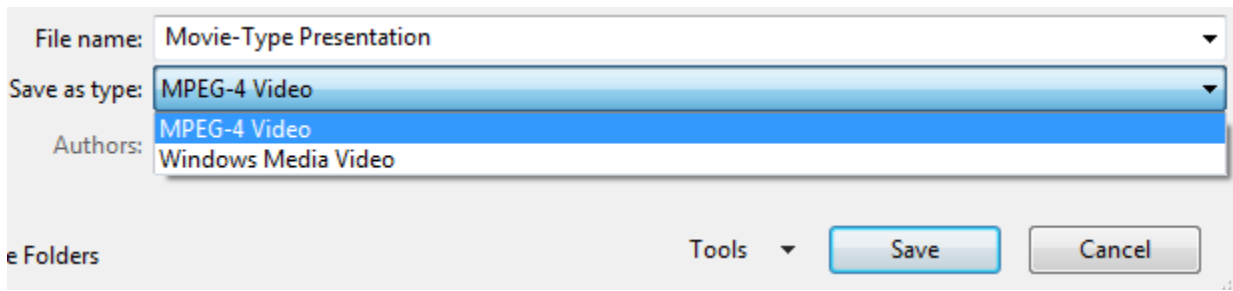

8. Click Save.
